Tournament Format:

Georgia Winter Challenge Series Events are 5-fish Catch-Photo-Release (CPR) tournament powered by TourneyX. There is no limit to the number of bass photos Competitors may submit during the Competition Period. Regardless of the number of photos submitted, only the five longest bass submitted by a Competitor throughout the month of competition will post to his score and will determine the final ranking.

Event Registration:

\$30 Entry Fee and \$10 optional for Big Bass Pot unless otherwise specified on the TourneyX Tournament page

TourneyX Membership and Registration:

Prior to the first day of competition, each angler who wishes to participate must (a.) sign up as a TourneyX user and then (b.) register on TourneyX and pay an entry fee for the specific Challenge(s) in which he wishes to compete.

Competitors are not restricted to their own state of residence. Prize winners must be prepared to submit proof of valid Georgia fishing license.

Photos for a Georgia Winter Challenge Series Event may be submitted only for bass caught from Georgia waters. A bass submitted for a Georgia Winter Challenge Series Event may be eligible for submission to other events, if permitted by the rules for those other events.

Competition Rules:

The rules are in two parts. Competition Rules Standards as outlined by Kayak Bass Fishing (KBF) and this specific Georgia Winter Challenge Series Rules Addendum.

By registering, each competitor acknowledges he/she has read and agrees to abide by (a.) the Competition Rules Standards (including the Release and Indemnification Agreement and Copyright and Use of Images Agreement) and to (b.) the specific rules outlined in the Competition Rules Addendum on this page.

Competition Period:

Competition Period Start and End dates are displayed on each State Challenge page on TourneyX.

Start—Competition begins at 12:00 a.m. on the first day of the Competition Period. Photos of fish caught only after the Competition Start time are acceptable.

End—Competition ends at 11:59 p.m. on the last day of the Competition Period. All photos must be submitted to TourneyX by the Competition End time.

Identifier:

The IDENTIFIER CODE is a Unique Angler Identifier Code that will be released at the start of the tournament and is available through your TourneyX Dashboard. Your code will differ from other anglers in this event.

Eligible Water & Location:

Competitors may submit fish caught ONLY in waters located inside the boundaries of the state(s), with the following exception. On some boundary waters, a reciprocal licensing agreement between the bordering states allows anglers with valid fishing licenses issued by one state to legally fish specific waters in the neighboring state. In boundary waters with reciprocal license agreements, a Competitor may submit photos of fish caught in any water covered by the agreement. The state in which the fish was caught is determined by the location the angler launched from.

Awarding of Prizes

**Payments will be paid out via PayPal, to the PayPal email address that the payment was made from unless otherwise specified by the angler receiving payment.

Payouts are after any TourneyX tournament fees, PayPal, and any other fees associated with the event.

Cash prizes, if any, will be processed and distributed as quickly as possible following announcement of Competition results, verification of eligibility, and identification of winners.

Disputes and Appeals:

Any Competitor who wishes to dispute or protest a rules violation penalty, a judge's scoring decision, or other action that materially affected the Competitor's ranking or prize eligibility must file a protest with the Tournament Director in writing or via email within 24 hours from the time and date of the protested action. Only Competitors in the Tournament where the protested action occurred may lodge protests. Protests must be handled privately. All parties of interest will be provided a copy. The Tournament Director will review the Competitor's claims, thoroughly investigate the disputed decision, and issue a ruling. All Tournament Director rulings are final following the completion of the initial investigation.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY AGREEMENT

READ BEFORE REGISTERING FOR ANY GEORGIA WINTER CHALLENGE SERIES COMPETITIVE EVENT AND/OR SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT

In consideration of being allowed to participate in any way in the Georgia Winter Challenge Series Event and its related competition and activities, I, the undersigned (or registrant), being at least 18 years of age, acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. I affirm that my participation in any Online Event is voluntary and declare that I am physically fit and capable to participate in such; and
2. I acknowledge that kayak fishing participation and competition involves certain inherent dangers, and hazards; that the risk of injury from the activities involved in this event is significant, including the potential for permanent paralysis and death, and while particular skills, physical fitness, equipment, and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist; and,
3. I KNOWINGLY AND FREELY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, both known and unknown, EVEN IF ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES or others, and assume full responsibility for my participation; and,
4. I willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary Terms and Conditions for Participation. If, however, I observe any unusual significant hazard during my presence or participation, I will remove myself from participation and immediately bring such to the attention of the Tournament Director; and,
